

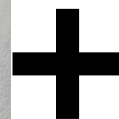

- Doctors must do an oath that says that they would treat their patients well. It is called the Hippocratic Oath. Apuleius was the patron god of medicine.





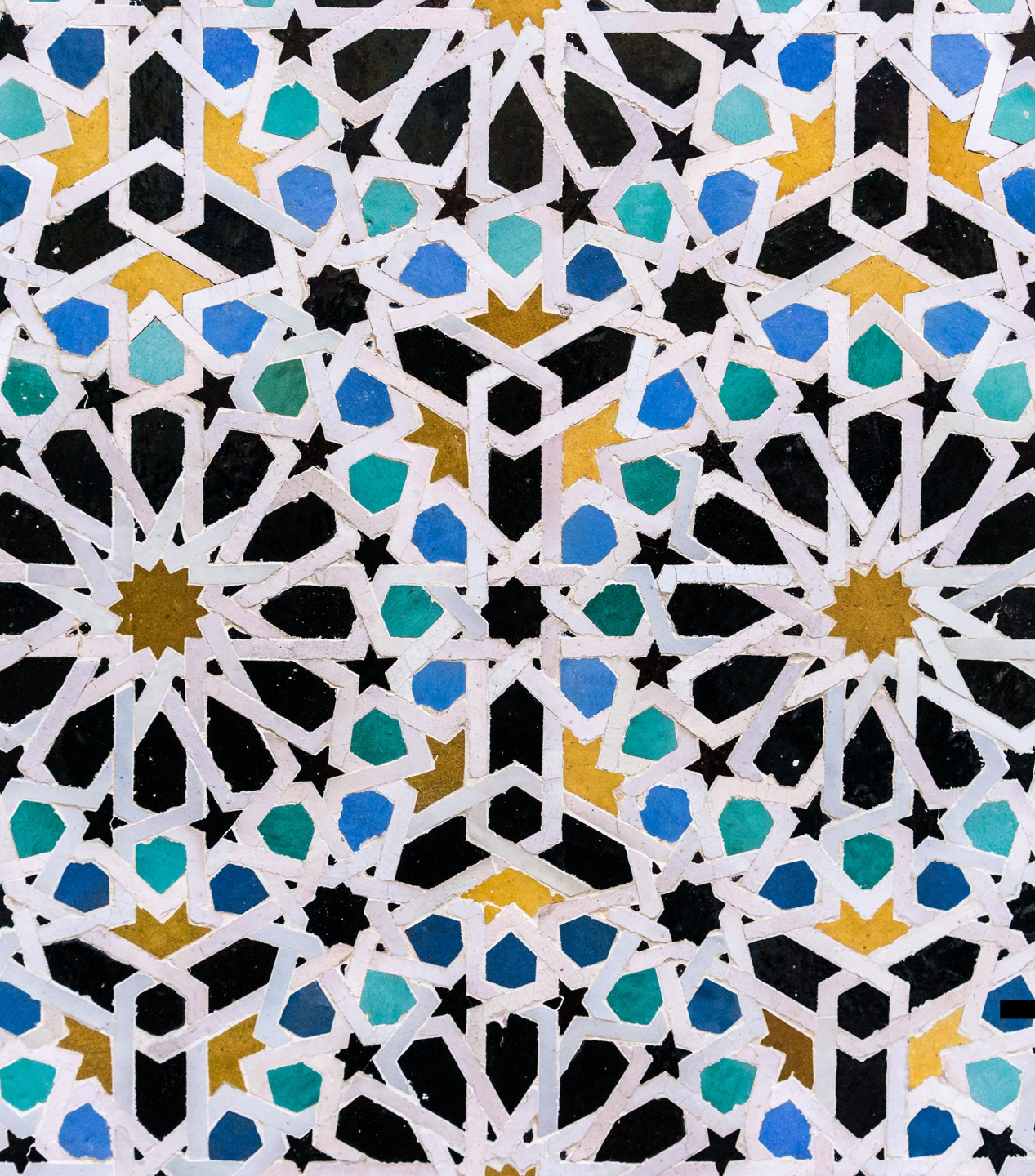
Sport
