

# Save the Children's Christmas Jumper Day

Christmas Jumper Day happens each December. It was started by the charity Save the Children in order to raise money to help children who need it most all around the world. People are asked to wear a fun, festive jumper for the day and donate money to help others.



## Why Fundraise?

In many countries across the world, Christmas is a time for people to swap gifts and enjoy time with their families. However, many millions of children are not so lucky.

In some countries, children have had to escape war and famine. This means that many children do not have enough nutritious food, may not be able to go to school or cannot see a doctor if they are poorly. Some children have had to leave their homes and travel for many miles to find somewhere safe to live. Others may have been affected by natural disasters such as earthquakes or floods.

The charity, Save the Children, uses money raised from Christmas Jumper Day and other fundraising to help ensure that children across the world stay safe, healthy and are able to learn.

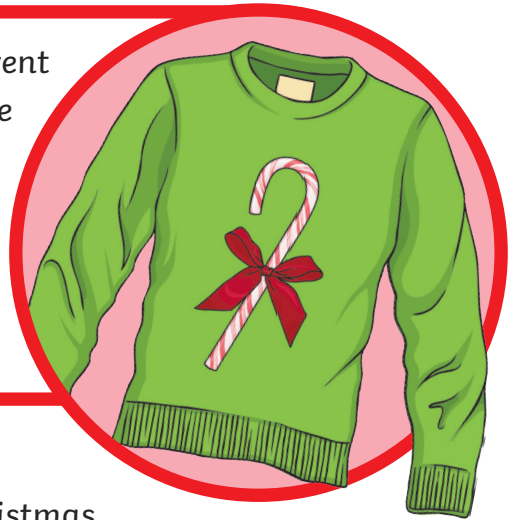

Some children are refugees and have had to leave their homes and travel for many miles to find somewhere safe to live.

## What Does Save the Children Do?

Save the Children helps to protect children and their families across the world.

- In Afghanistan, Save the Children are providing education to primary school aged boys and girls, as well as training teachers and providing teaching materials. In 2020 the education programmes reached 12 million children worldwide.
- In Yemen and Syria, the charity helps to support children affected by war.

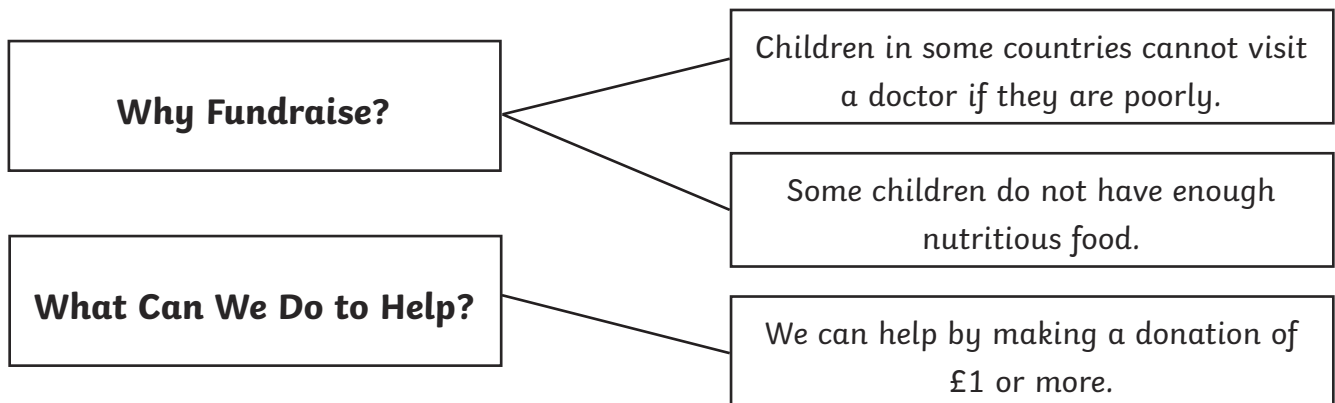

# Save the Children's Christmas Jumper Day

Christmas Jumper Day is an annual charity event which is held each December. It was created by the international charity Save the Children in order to raise money and awareness of children whose lives are affected by poverty, disease or conflict. On Christmas Jumper Day, people are encouraged to donate money in exchange for wearing a festive Christmas jumper. Since its first event in 2012, Christmas Jumper Day has become more and more popular in many schools and workplaces.



## Did You Know...?

- Save the Children was founded on 15<sup>th</sup> April 1919.
- In 2020, Save the Children were able to help 27.9 million children with their health and nutrition programmes.
- A £1 donation could provide water for 3 weeks for a child at school in Somalia.

## Why Fundraise?

Christmas is a time for celebration for many people: to give gifts and cards to special people, to decorate Christmas trees, to feast on delicious food and to enjoy time with families. However, it is also a time to remember the many millions of children across the globe who are not so fortunate.

Sadly, many children's lives around the world are affected by war, natural disasters and famine. As a result, for some children, nutritious food is scarce and famine is a very real risk. In some areas, children may not have the opportunity to

go to school or learn to read and write. In addition, some children may not be able to visit a doctor or attend hospital if they are injured or poorly. Some children who are refugees have had to leave their homes and travel for many miles in order to find somewhere safe to live.

When you wear your Christmas jumper and donate to the charity, remember that Save the Children aims to ensure that all children have their human rights met, as described in the **UNCRC**.

The UNCRC is an international agreement for children's rights. Every child has the right to survival, protection and education. The UNCRC is made up of 54 articles that set out children's rights.
