construction	The building of houses, factories, roads and bridges.	landmark	A building which is easily noticed and can be used to find your location
bridge	A structure carrying a road, path or railway over an obstacle such as a river.	engineer	A person who designs, builds, or maintains engines, machines, or structures.
suspension bridge	A type of bridge that is supported from above by cables.	structure	A building or other object built from several parts.
rigid	Unable to bend, stretch or twist easily. Not flexible.	flexible	Can bend easily without breaking.

Sir Christopher Wren

Sir Christopher Wren 30 October 1632– 8 March 1723 was an English astronomer, geometer, and mathematician-physicist, as well as one of the most highly acclaimed English architects in history. He was accorded responsibility for rebuilding 52 churches in the City of London after the Great Fire in 1666, including what is regarded as his masterpiece, St Paul's Cathedral, on Ludgate Hill, completed in 1710.
