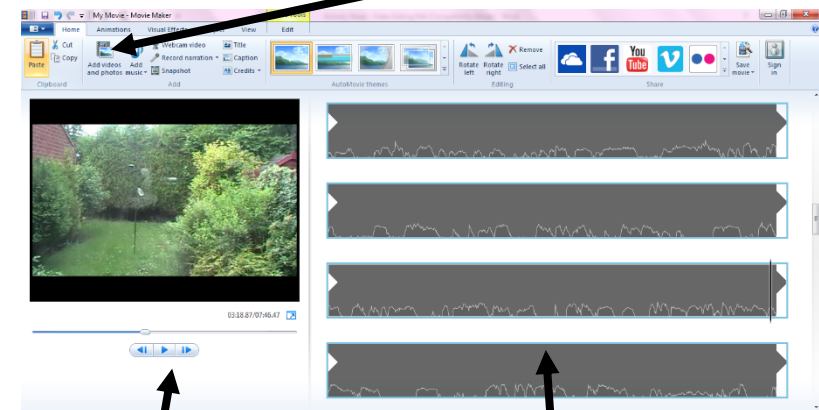


Key vocabulary	Definitions
Digital media	Any media that are encoded in machine-readable formats. It refers to any kind of information broadcast to us through a screen. This information might be found on websites or in applications, software packages, video games, and more. Digital media can be created, viewed, distributed, modified and preserved on digital electronics devices.
Image	A digital image is an image composed of picture elements, also known as pixels.
Video	The recording, reproducing, or broadcasting of moving visual images.
Sound	Digital audio is a representation of sound recorded in, or converted into, digital form. In digital audio, the sound wave of the audio signal is encoded as numerical samples in a continuous sequence.
Post Production	The main tasks are editing and arranging video clips, deciding what to include and what to leave out, adding sound and other finishing touches.
